Drone Use Policy

Preamble:

Due to the increasing availability and use of drones there is likely to be an increase in the incidents of drone use at Te Nohoaka o Tukiauau. The Trust has the following concerns about drone use at Te Nohoaka o Tukiauau:

- Invasion of privacy of the residents at the Wetlands (both permanent and temporary residents)
- Disturbing and / or causing stress to wildlife particularly during breeding and nesting seasons
- Publicizing the location of rare birds or animals that the Trust have deemed it is important to protect
- Creating a hazard for other Wetland users, e.g. low flying or poorly controlled drones colliding into people or structures
- Creating a hazard for other air traffic as the Wetlands sits within the boundaries of Dunedin International Airport controlled airspace zone https://www.airshare.co.nz/maps

The Trust recognizes the value drones have as a promotion and management tool, e.g. identifying location of weeds.

The Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) rules stipulate the following for flying drones (Remotely Piloted Aircraft Systems) or model airplanes:

- 1. Fly the aircraft so it isn't a hazard to other aircraft, property and people.
- 2. Fly only in daylight.
- 3. The pilot is able to see the aircraft with their own eyes (eg, not through binoculars, a monitor, or smartphone) or have a second person with you as an observer.
- 4. The pilot will fly their aircraft no higher than 120 m (400 feet) above ground level.
- 5. The pilot will avoid flying over people they do not have consent from.
- 6. The pilot must have consent from the owner of the land they are flying over.
- 7. The pilot must have knowledge of airspace, especially restrictions applying in the area they want to fly.
- 8. Fly no closer than 4 km from any uncontrolled aerodrome.
- 9. The pilot will fly their aircraft clear of controlled airspace. Controlled airspace normally extends well beyond 4 km from a controlled aerodrome, and to the ground.
- 10. Give way to all manned aircraft.
- 11. Are flying an aircraft that is no heavier than 25 kg.

Te Nohoaka o Tukiauau / Sinclair Wetlands Drone Policy

- No drones are to be flown within the Te Nohoaka o Tukiauau boundary without permission from the Te Nohoaka o Tukiauau / Sinclair Wetlands coordinator
- · Permission will only be granted if drone usage will not disturb wildlife
- Film footage gathered by drone can only be used for commercial purposes with the permission of the Trust
- The drone operator must obtain consent from all people in the area they will be flying over prior to flying the drone.
- Drone pilots must comply with all CAA regulations and have full responsibility for safe operation of the drone. This includes:
 - a. logging all drone flights in MyFlights https://www.airshare.co.nz/my-flights/plan-a-flight
 - b. following instructions issued by MyFlights
 - c. contacting Air Traffic control prior to the planned flight for final clearance
 - d. contacting Air Traffic control once flight is completed
